The first day of school is **Thursday, August 4<sup>th</sup>**. Kinder school hours are 7:45 a.m.- 1:50 a.m. (Wednesday hours are 7:45 a.m.-12:40 p.m. due to early dismissal.) Adult supervision will be on the playground at 7:15 a.m and that is the earliest time students can be dropped off.

Here are some things to help inform you about our classroom rules and procedures that will be implemented.

## CLASSROOM MANAGEMENT

At Robins, we follow the Positive Behavior Interventions and Support (PBIS) framework. The kindergarten classroom management program emphasizes positive behaviors (do's) rather than negative behaviors (don'ts). Students are expected to follow the "3 B's" at all times while at school.

### The 3 Bee's

1. Be safe 
2. Be respectful 
3. Be responsible

First warning..... Verbal warning

Second warning....Loss of team points

Third warning.....Think time and loss of privileges and/or conference with parents/Think time in other classroom

### **REWARDS**

Verbal praise

## HOMEWORK POLICY

Homework is an important component of your child's education. It is an extension of the classroom learning process. Students will have to read or be read to a minimum of 20 minutes everyday at home. Read and response forms will need to be signed and returned to school. Parent-Read-Aloud is an important factor that contributes to your child's success in reading. Here are some suggestions for you as you read aloud to your child:

- A. Use the title and cover illustration to encourage your child to predict what the story is about.
- B. Stop and discuss interesting parts and pictures.
- C. Talk about the main character(s). Ask, "Who are they?" and "What are they like?"
- D. Discuss the setting. Where does the story take place?
- E. What is the problem in the story? How is it solved?

In addition, at the beginning of each full week, your child will be receiving homework.

**Homework is the student's responsibility and he/she should do as much of the work as possible on their own.** Completed homework will then be returned by the end of the week.

### STAR OF THE WEEK

Each child is assigned a special week during the school year. During that week, the child is given many leadership privileges. One of the opportunities that your child will have during that week will be to decorate a bulletin board with important things about him or her. For example, bringing a picture of their family, baby pictures, vacation pictures etc.

Students and families will be notified when it is their turn as star of the week.
