I have been teaching for 27 years. I taught First grade for six years and the rest have been in Kindergarten. I graduated from the University of Arizona. Go Wildcats! I earned my master's degree in Bilingual/Multicultural Education. I have endorsements in Early Childhood Education, English as a Second Language, and Reading Specialist. I was fortunate to be one of five teachers in Tucson to win the "Rodel" award where I got to mentor seven student teachers. It was a wonderful experience to teach our future teachers! In May 2017, I was also fortunate to win "District Elementary Teacher of the Year" for TUSD. It was a great honor. I am lucky to do what I love for a living.

Your child will be learning all subjects (reading, writing, math, science, social studies, music, art, & P.E.) through themes. You will be receiving newsletters of what we will be learning. Your child will be developing a strong sense of independence, critical thinking skills, as well as expanding their creative side while still learning the basics.

The first day of school is **Thursday, August 3rd**. Kinder school hours are 7:45 a.m.-1:50 p.m. (Wednesday hours are 7:45 a.m.-12:40 p.m. due to early dismissal.) Adult supervision will be on the playground at 7:15 a.m. On Wednesdays, parents will be allowed to drive through the first entrance. Cones will be removed only on this day. All parents must have a pick up sign with their child's name, which I will provide. The sign must be placed on the right side of the dashboard and used **every time** you are picking up your child.



CLASSROOM MANAGEMENT

My classroom management program emphasizes positive behaviors (do's) rather than negative behaviors (don'ts).

HOMEWORK POLICY

Homework is an important component of your child's education. It is an extension of the classroom learning process. Students will have to read or be read to a minimum of 20 minutes everyday at home. Read and response forms will need to be signed and returned to school. Parent-Read-Aloud is an important factor that contributes to your child's success in reading. Here are some suggestions for you as you read aloud to your child:

- **A.** Use the title and cover illustration to encourage your child to predict what the story is about.
- **B.** Stop and discuss interesting parts and pictures.
- **C.** Talk about the main character(s). Ask," Who are they?" and "What are they like?"
- **D.** Discuss the setting. Where does the story take place?
- **E.** What is the problem in the story? How is it solved?

In addition, at the beginning of each week, your child will be receiving homework.

Homework is the student's responsibility and he/she should do as much of the work as possible on their own. Homework folder will be given out every Monday. Please have your child return folder with completed homework on Friday. He/she will receive a star on the homework chart every week the homework packet is returned. Failure to do so may result in loss of privileges and lower grade. There will only be reading homework on short weeks.

STAR OF THE WEEK

Each child is assigned a special week during the school year. During that week, the child is given many leadership privileges. One of the opportunities that your child will have during that week will be to decorate a bulletin board with important things about him or her. For example, bringing a picture of their family, baby pictures, vacation pictures etc.

Students will be told who the "Star of the Week" will be.
